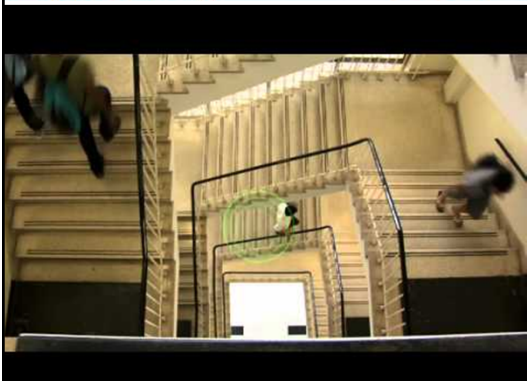


3D Indoor Tracking and Location for Fire Fighters and Public Safety Responders



Showcase Event on December 2, 2012 at Toronto City Hall

The Canadian Interoperability Technology Interest Group (CITIG) in partnership with the Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs (CAFC) and Toronto Fire Service (TFS) are hosting a one-day event in Toronto showcasing 3D Indoor Tracking and Location for Fire Fighters and Public Safety Responders.

The first of its kind in Canada, this event will provide an opportunity for participants to witness firsthand the challenges and opportunities of this emerging technology through presentations, demos and a live exercise. While the primary focus of the event is to support ongoing research by Fire Services, responders from other disciplines such as Police, Paramedics, HUSAR Teams, Military and Emergency Management are also encouraged to register. There is no cost to attend, but registration is mandatory. Due to space limitations, registrations must first be approved.

Companies interested in participating in the demo and live exercise should contact the organizing committee immediately! A small fee will be charged to participating companies to recoup event costs.

Results of the showcase will be shared during the Sixth Canadian Public Safety Interoperability Workshop (December 2 to 5 in Toronto).
